

Annual Report 2025/26

The Council held ten meetings across the year, eight in Adfa and two in Llanwyddelan.

During May an inspection was undertaken by Powys of all the trees on the highway in Dwyriw. Some were marked for annual monitoring, and the rest will be checked again in five years.

In July work was completed to repair the slate seat in Cefn Coch and a successful application to the Trust Fund secured funding for this cost.

The council accepted its Section 6 Biodiversity Report for the previous three years and approved a plan for the 2026/29 period.

It was reported at the September meeting that work had been completed to the Carmel Bridge, and it had now re-opened.

The Council set its annual budget at the meeting in January and the annual precept agreed.

In February it was noted that the burial ground wall in Llanllugan was in need of repair with a section collapsing into the neighbouring field. A local builder was appointed to undertake this work which was completed in April.

Following the reports issued by ROSPA at their yearly play area inspection it was decided that the fence around the site would be replaced with one made from recycled plastic.

County Cllr Sian Cox attended the February meeting to talk about her hope for better links between the County Council and local community and town councils.

Across the year numerous pot holes and highways issues were reported to the Highways department with mixed results.
